



PhD in Applied Mathematics

We offer attractive stipends to postgraduate research students to undertake their PhD studies in the Department of Mathematics. Outstanding applicants may be recommended to apply for the Hong Kong PhD fellowship scheme offered by the University Grants Committee of the Hong Kong Government. A successful applicant of this prestigious scheme would receive HK\$20,000 (HK\$7.8 \approx US\$1) stipend per month, plus HK\$10,000 travel allowance per year, for three years. (The median monthly employment earning in Hong Kong, as an indicator of the cost of living, is HK\$10,000.)

You will find here an English-language multi-cultured learning environment, world-class professors and excellent research facilities.

Professors in Applied Mathematics include, notably,

- Hermann BRUNNER, 2008 David Borwein Distinguished Career Award (Canadian Mathematical Society), fellow of the Fields Institute, member of the Committee on Grants and Scholarships and group chair of Pure/Applied Mathematics and Statistical Sciences of the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council of Canada, associate editor of leading journals such as SIAM Journal on Numerical Analysis and IMA Journal of Numerical Analysis;
- Michael NG, plenary speaker of SIAM conference on Applied Linear Algebra (2009), associate editor of leading journals such as SIAM Journal on Scientific Computing;
- Tao TANG, winner of Leslie Fox prize, Feng Kang Prize, National Outstanding Young Scientist Award, first prize in the natural science category of the 2007 Tertiary Institutions Science Technology awards, associate editor of leading journals such as SIAM Journal on Numerical Analysis.
